A 15-minute daily team meeting to share progress, report impediments, and make commitments. During this meeting, each team member answers 3 questions:

- What have I done since the last meeting?
- What will I do before the next meeting?
- What prevents me from performing my work as efficiently as possible?

Definition of Done

A working agreement that the team agrees upon and displays prominently somewhere in the team room, which includes a list of criteria which must be met before a product backlog item (PBI) can be considered done.

Failure to meet these criteria at the end of a sprint normally implies that the work should not be counted toward that sprint's velocity.





The rate at which a team completes work, often measured in story points. In Scrum, this tells us how much product backlog effort a team can handle in one sprint. This can be estimated by viewing previous sprints, assuming the team composition and sprint duration are kept constant. It can also be established on a sprint-by-sprint basis using commitment-based planning.
